



**COUNCIL NOTES**

Township of Bastard and South Burgess

Council met on Monday, December 2, 1985 in the Council Chambers.

- The Inauguration Ceremony took place at 11:00 A.M. with Reverend J.H. Seeley officiating.
- paid road voucher #11 in the amount of \$11,502.11 and general voucher #21 in the amount of \$22,602.10.
- requested to up-date to 1984 market value from 1975 value for the taxation year 1987.
- proclaimed December 10, 1985 as Human Rights Day in the township.
- authorized the road superintendent to contact G. Tackaberry & Sons Construction to clean up Portland Waste Disposal Site and place a container at the site for dumping debris.
- repealed a resolution dated November 18, 1985 to appoint Library Board members.
- appointed Cathy Bongers, Brys Scovil and Anna Greenhorn to serve on the Rideau Lakes Library Board for 1986, 1987, 1988.
- appointed Pat McManus to the Portland Area Community Board.
- paid a resident for three sheep killed by wolves.
- appointed Barbara Bresee as Clerical Technician to full time employment and John Seward as Delta Waste Disposal Attendant.
- engaged Ward Mallette to put the tax receivables on the computer system.

Council adjourned to meet again December 16, 1985 or at the call of the Reeve.

A special meeting was held on Thursday December 5, 1985.

- passed a resolution that the Municipality of Bastard and South assume responsibility for a management lease of the Portland Dock (Government) and apply for an agreement to lease the docking facility.
