Trapping beaver for their hides.

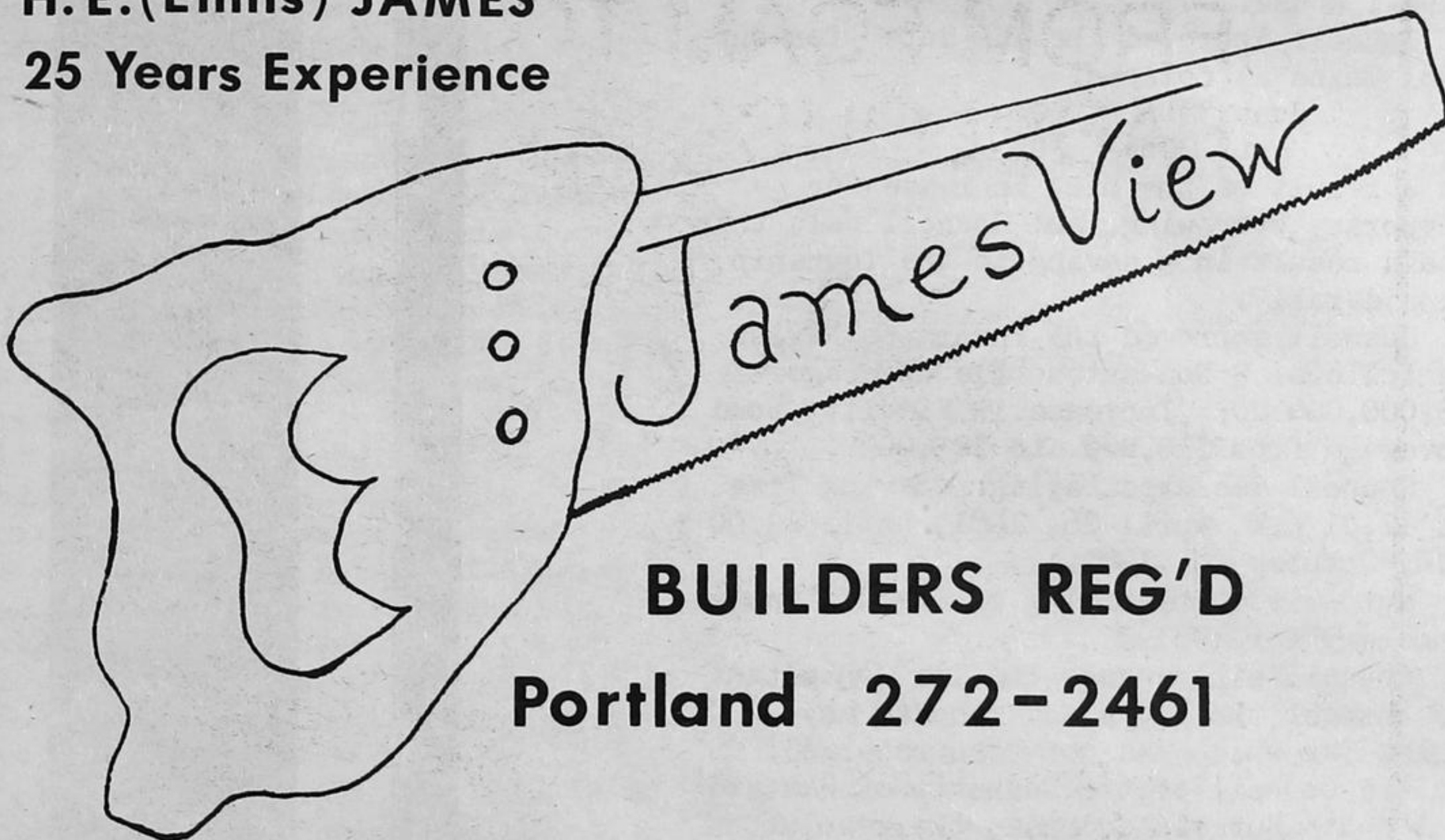
I read it in the daytime;
