COUNCIL NOTES; TOWNSHIP REAR OF LEEDS & LANSDOWNE

Regular meetings were held in the Council Chamber on Monday, April 3 and Monday, April 17, 1978. Regular meetings in May will be May 1 and May 15 at 8:00 p.m. in Council Chambers.

Warble fly control powder is presently available, at no cost, to all cattle owners in this Township. Packets may be picked up at the Township Office during office hours.

Because of the increase in number of voting residents in Poll 1, this Poll has been divided into two and will be known as Poll 1 and Poll 6, Poll 1 consisting of Lots 1 to 4 inclusive in the Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Concession of Leeds, and the balance of the original Poll 1 now being Poll 6. This division will be effective commencing with the election year 1978, as set out in The Municipal Elections Act.

The budget for the Township was set at the regular meeting on April 17. The Residential and Farm mill rate for 1978 was set at 121.55 mills and the Commercial and Business mill rate for 1978 will be 138.34. Tax Bills will be mailed to property owners in the middle of May.

Grants were made to the First Lyndhurst Cub Pack, the Gananoque and District Association for the Mentally retarded and to the YM-YWCA for the municipal portion of the 1978 taxes on Grippen Lake Camp.

Residents are advised that it is once again the time of the year when permits must be obtained for outside burning. Permits are available from Mr. Art Hughes in Lyndhurst and from Ralph Webb, Fire Chief, in Seeleys Bay.

As indicated in the advertisement placed in local papers by the North Leeds Planning Board, copies of the draft amended Official Plan for the North Leeds Planning Area are now in the Township Office and may be looked over in the office or taken out for a few days upon payment of a \$9.00 deposit.

Residents are reminded that a Building Permit must be obtained for any repair, construction, alteration, addition, demolition or moving of buildings within the Township. Mr. Derek Turnbull, the Building Inspector, is available on Monday mornings in the Township Office for advice and for issuing permits. Please call 928-2423 to make an appointment if it is not convenient to come in on Monday mornings.

The Road Department is working summer hours from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Calls will be answered by the Municipal Office during the absence of the Roads Personnel on jobs.

INSURANCE FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW

QUESTION: Do traffic violations affect my insurance rates?

ANSWER: Every two or three years, most insurance companies obtain an abstract of your driving record. If it is found that you have acquired traffic violations at any time during the last three years, whether or not you lost points, your rates may be surcharged as follows:

- Any moving traffic violation, including speeding, disobeying traffic signal, driving unsafe vehicle -- first two tickets, no surcharge; any additional ticket--surcharge of 25% per ticket.
- Failure to report accident, careless driving, racing, improper passing of school bus -- surcharge of 50% per ticket.
- Impaired driving, driving while licence is suspended, failure to remain at scene of accident -- minimum surcharge of 100% per ticket.

Any surcharge stays on your policy for three years following the date of the ticket.

North Leeds Senior Softball '78

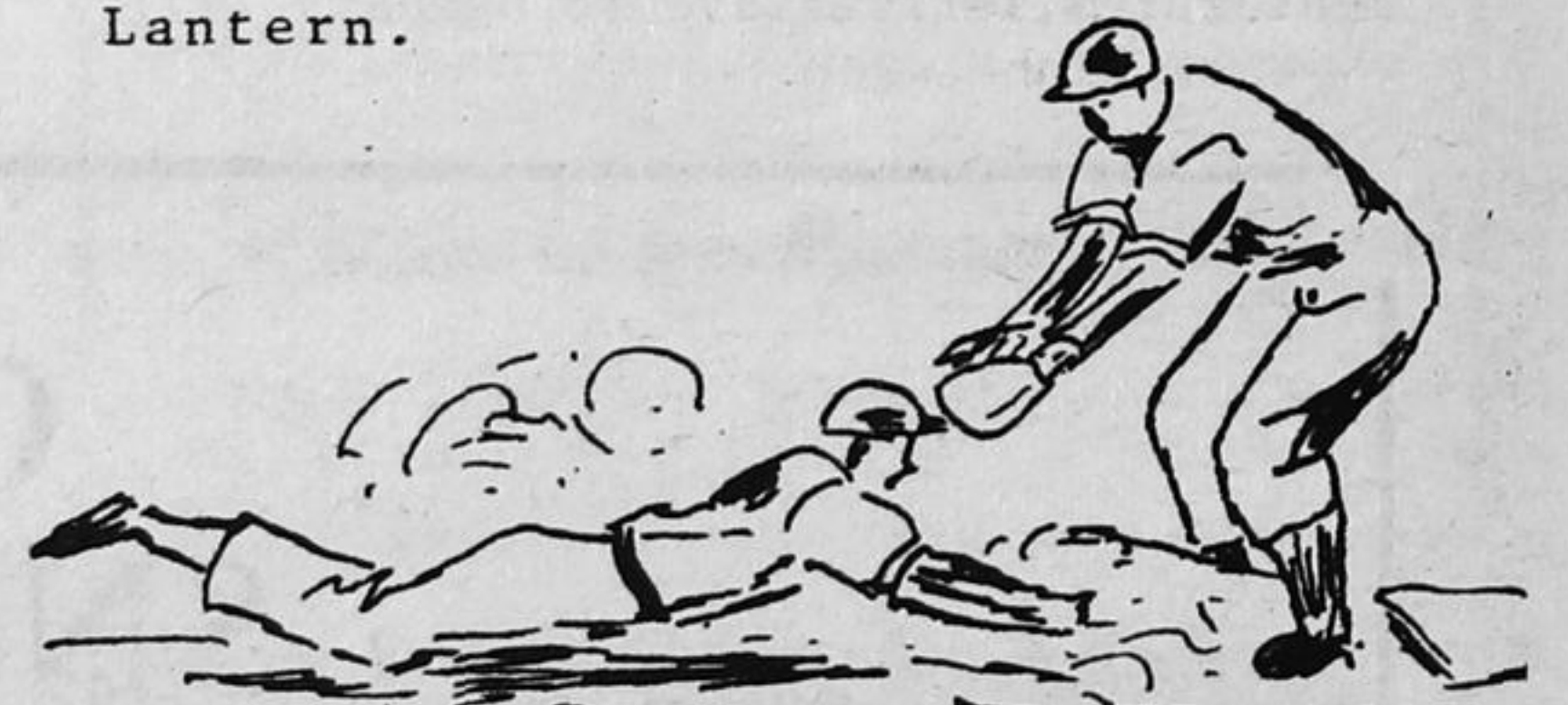

The teams this year are from Gananoque, Newboro, Elgin, Westport, two from Seeleys Bay, and perhaps Delta.

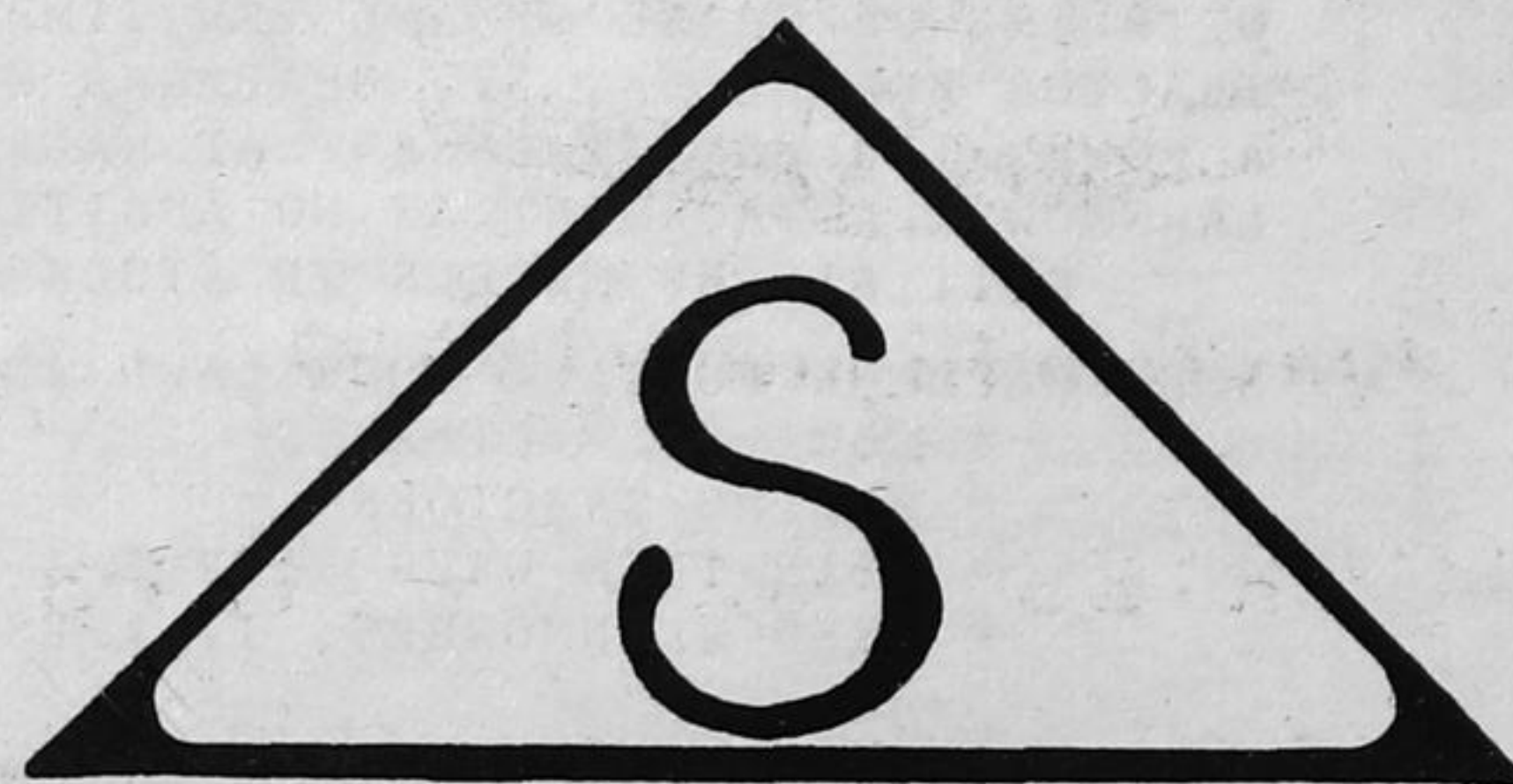
The games will be played on Tues., Thurs. and Sunday at 8:30 p.m. beginning May 14.
