EARNs NATIONAL AWARD

Paul Chant of Delta has received a Canadian Merit Award after being selected by the Outstanding Young Men and Women of Canada Program as an outstanding young man in 1978.

The Award reads that he was selected "In recognition of distinguished service, notable achievements and demonstrated leadership."

The Outstanding Young Men and Women Program is run by an advisory board made up of representatives of national service organizations. It annually selects young men and women from across Canada for Merit Awards for community work.

Since graduating as an Ontario Scholar from Rideau District High School, Paul has been a student at Queen's University. In addition to his scholastic duties he has taken an active part in the Chorale Ensemble (Queen's Choir) as well as the Queen's Musical Theatre.

At present he is on tour with the Chorale Ensemble for three weeks in Europe. The choir is scheduled for concerts in Holland, Germany, France, Austria and Hungary.

Since January 1st of 1978, Paul has been organist and Choir Director of St. Paul's United Church in Perth. Previous to that time he was organist for several years in Delta United, and took a keen interest in community work. Congratulations Paul!

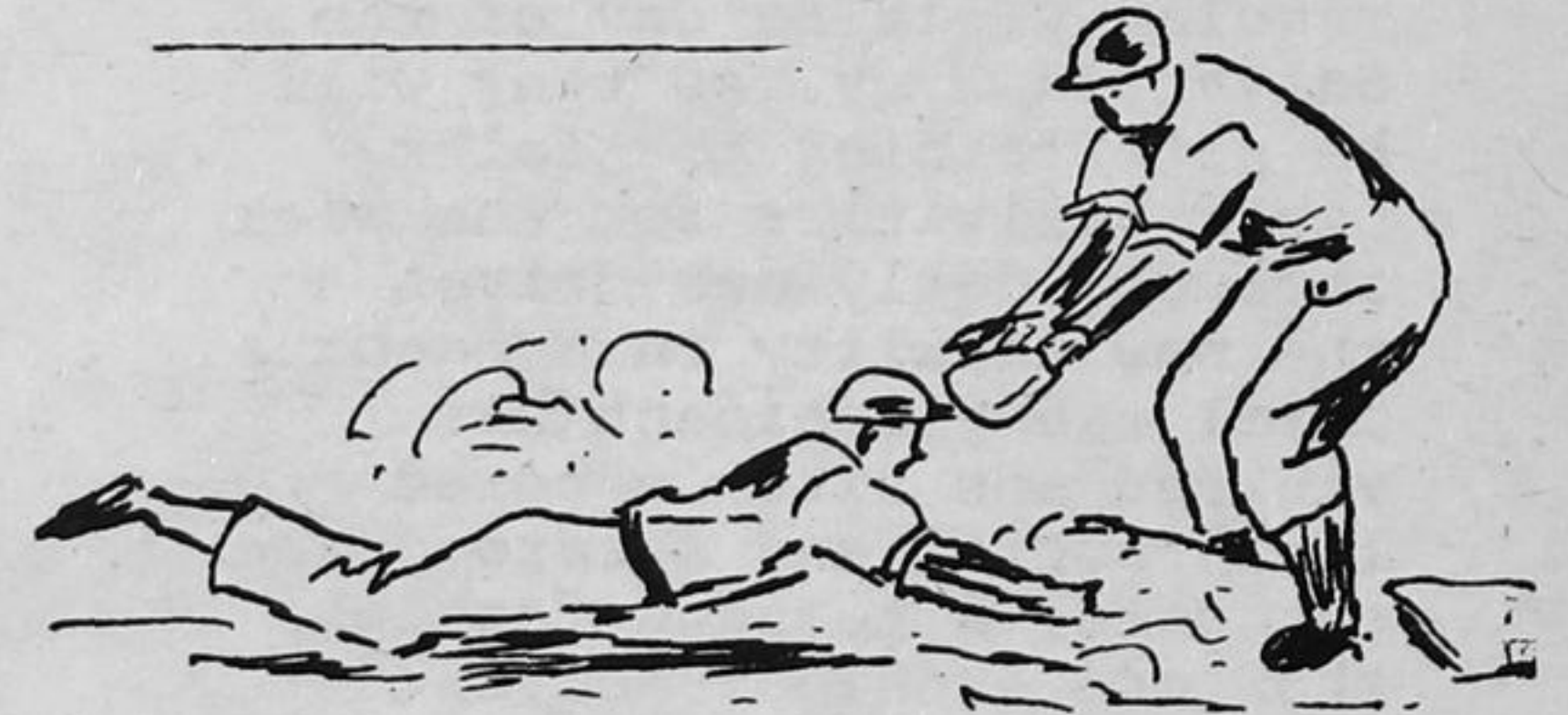
Softball '78
