Swine competition was won by Hilton Livingston (Athens).

Brent Niblock (Lyndhurst) was the dominant exhibitor in the poultry area which included 36 entries.

To File a Nomination

You will need a nomination paper stating the following:

1. The name and address of you, the nominee, in such a manner as to clearly identify you.
2. Must state the office nominated for.
3. Must be signed by at least ten (10) qualified electors with full addresses.

Also you must present a signed consent to the nomination and a declaration of qualification.

Once you have these papers you are ready to go to the Township Clerk. Nomination day is October 23rd. On that day between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. you may file your papers. However, if you are unsure of your papers you are entitled to file during the regular hours of the township clerk in the week immediately preceding nomination day.

This can be important. When you file before nomination day, the clerk will check your papers and if they are correct in form he/she will issue you a written certification. If you file on nomination day he/she is allowed to check the papers the following day and if they are not correct you would be disqualified.

That is it! After the clerk issues your certification he/she will post your name and you're off and running. Think it over! There is no higher calling than to serve your fellow man.
