

Council Notes TOWNSHIP REAR OF LEEDS

The meeting was held on August 21st 1978 in Council Chambers with Reeve Hubert Sly in the Chair.

A delegation of concerned residents met with Council concerning the Seeley's Bay ferry. Ferry operator, Bob Aldridge, reported that over \$8,000. has been spent this summer on the operation and maintenance of the ferry, but it is still hazardous. Operating hours have been cut due to the lack of lights and the landings are in need of repair. Mr. Aldridge explained that even with these repairs, the ferry remains obsolete, and considering the increasing number of passengers in need of this service, the monies could better be spent on a road connecting with Burnt Hills Road.

Council advised that the residents would have to build the road before they could consider the problem and since part of it is in Storrington Twp., it would be necessary to share maintenance costs with them.

At the July 17th meeting, tenders were invited for snowplow/sander equipment and a 6 ton diesel truck. Two tenders were opened at the past meeting for the snowplow/sander with the contract going to Frink Co. The lone tender of Edward's Ford Mercury was accepted for the truck at \$33,268.00.

assistance is for those with chronic
disabilities, who can manage at home
with some outside help. Funding from
the Canada Works Grant ends this
month and will be resumed in 1979
by the Red Cross or the V.O.N.
Local groups and the Councils of
S. Crosby, N. Crosby, Bastard and
S. Burgess Townships and the
Villages of Newboro and Westport

have made donations to continue this service over the intervening months. Council granted \$846 to this project and thanked Mrs. Green for her work in the area.


Council adjourned with requests for a bigger supply of iced tea at the next meeting on September 5th.

A note of interest from the June 5th meeting of Council is the agreement of the Austen-Barclay Home in Athens to provide hostel accommodation for persons from the township who are sustained under the General Welfare Assistance Act for a fee of \$12/day, subject to approval of the Ministry of Community & Social Services.

Also in June, Council petitioned the Ministry of National Resources for the continuation of lake trout fishing season as is. This is from the second Saturday in March to September 8th, and is in the interests of the tourist industry in the area to keep these existing dates.

At the July 4th meeting, Council accepted the tender of Bulk Store Structures Ltd. for a sand and salt storage building at a price of \$33,000.
