

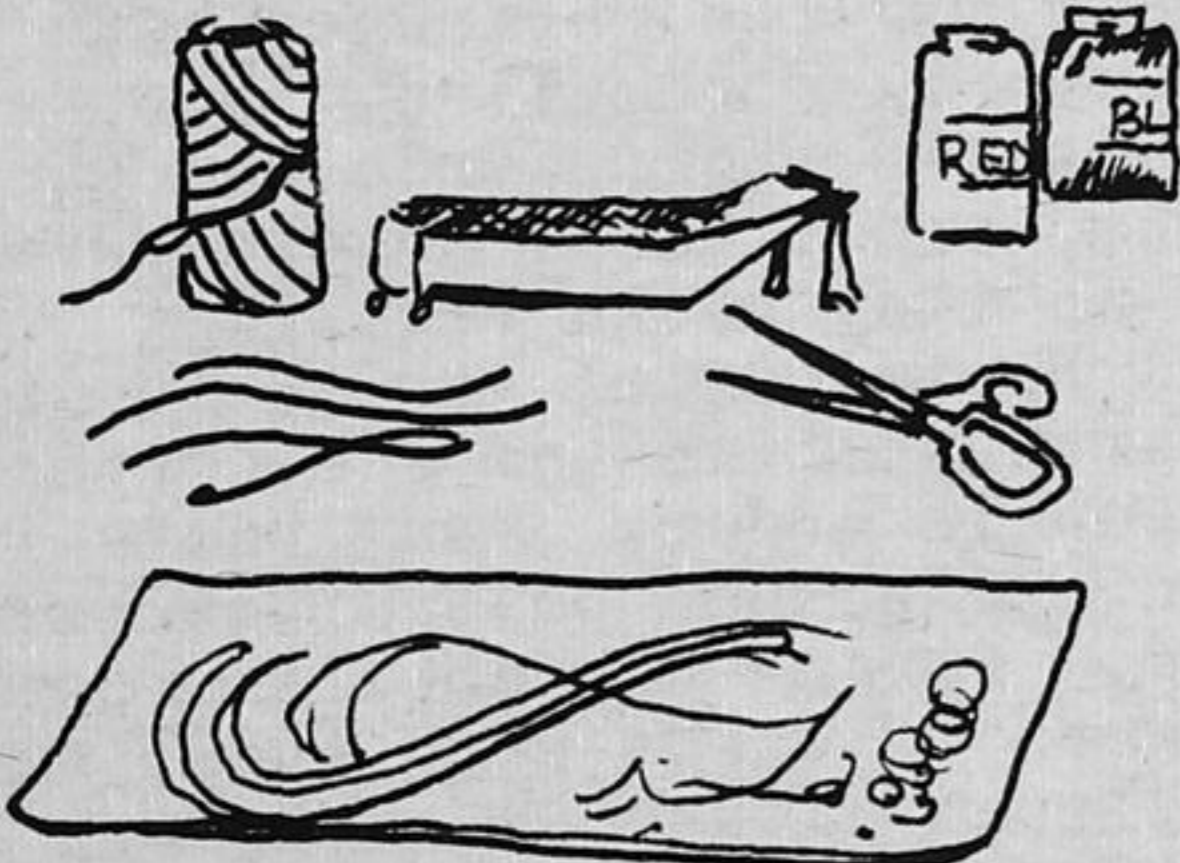

STRING PAINTING

 scissors
 poster paint
 plastic tray or flat dish

- Steps: *Spread some paint in dish or tray.
 *Cut string into various lengths.
 *Dip string in paint and soak.
 *Lay strings on paper and twist, press or loop for many patterns.

Experiment with different colours and types of string to find the most pleasing patterns.



Definitions

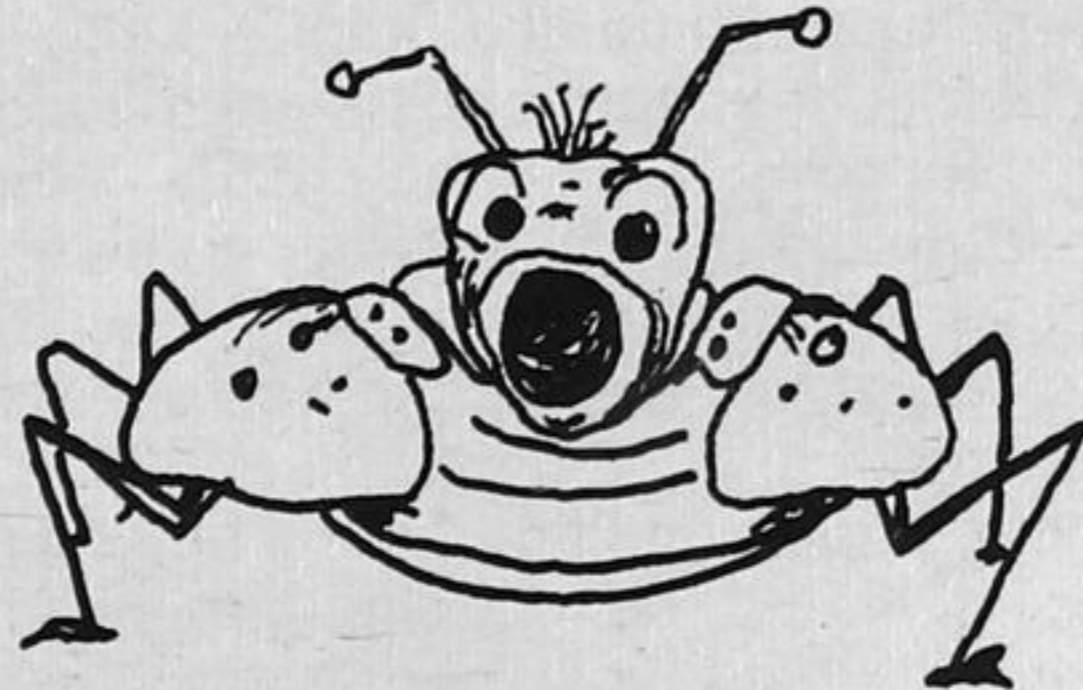
A meat thief?

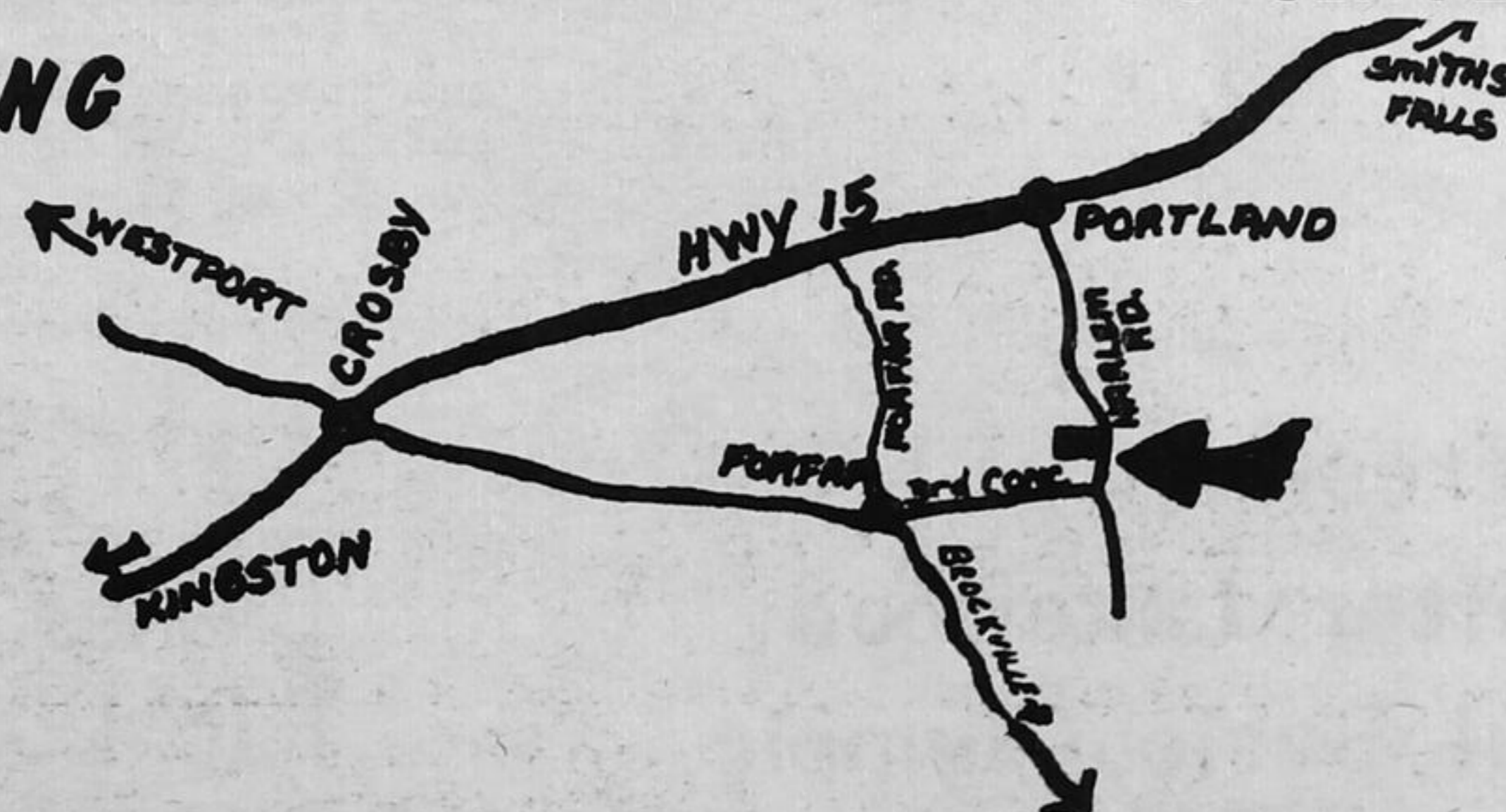
