Township of Bastard and South Burgess

Minutes of July 4, 1978, meeting held in Clerk's Office, Delta.

- motions were read and carried for the following accounts to be paid:
 Gen. Accounts- \$15,407.70
 Road Accounts- \$9595.54
- that Council authorize a $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mill (\$950.) for the Home-maker Services for North Leeds.
- that Council engage the services of the fence-viewers to investigate the line fence on Stuart Chant's property. Fence-viewers to be Eldred Hanna, Earl Lake & Ronald Chant, the date of the investigation to be July 15/78 at 10.00 A.M.
- that Council does not object to a right-of-way across the Road Allowance between Lots 24 & 25, Conc. 10, for Wallace & Irene Calvin.
- that the Council has determined to construct a Municipal Building, according to Section 336 (1) of the Municipal Act. The Council requests the OMB to issue an order under Section 63 & 64 of the Board, to dispense with the vote of the electors, as our Council has chosen the publication of a notice.
- that leave be given to introduce a by-law "To Authorize the construction of a Municipal Building at an estimated cost of \$163,000.00 under Section 336 (1) of the Municipal Act. This by-law was given first & second readings.
- that Council adjourn to meet July 17, 1978, at 1.00 P.M.

- motions were read and carried for payment of General Accounts in the amount of \$4243.56.
- that Council do not object to Severance No. B-139-78 and B-461-78, providing a clause is written in that no habitable dwellings are erected on these properties, and right-of-ways be provided for the existing residents, and no changes be made.

Plans for the Delta Fair exhibit were completed.

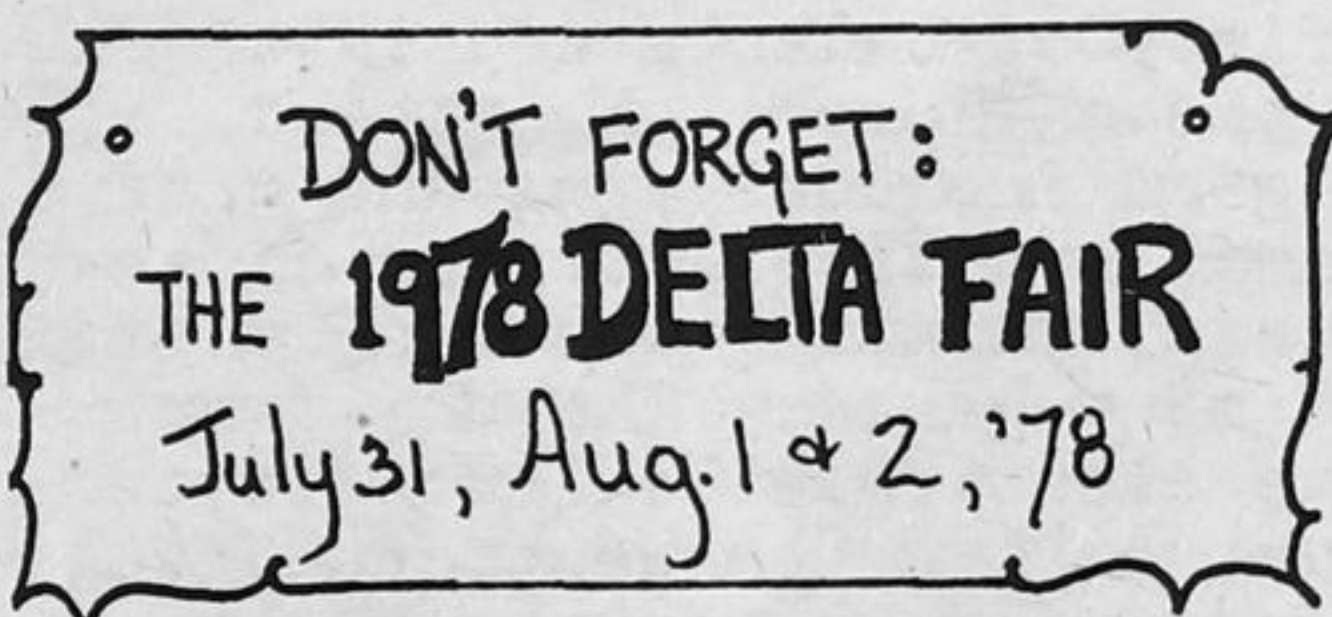
Some of the women reported on making sandwiches and drinks which were sent in to the men who were fighting the fire.
