It was decided that each member of the Board should concentrate on specific fields to ensure that all crafts (whether practiced at the moment in our area or not) would be on the curriculum throughout the year. The roles were subsequently divided as follows: Program Planning-Renie Milne, New Objectives-Diane Haskins, Planning Committee-Mary Warren, Pottery-Doris Graham, Public Relations-Phylliss Scott, Historian-Kay Merriman, Lantern Columnist-Constance Ryan (Vice-President), Chairperson for China Painters-Marion Stone (Treasurer) and our Recording Secretary is Vera Slemmon.

The main concern of this meeting was the future involvement of Rideau Crafts. Kay Merriman brought up the experience with crafts which was a true success at the Rideau Centennial School this past year. She mentioned that contacts should be emphasized between the older craftspeople in our area and the children. Renie Milne offered her studio for demonstrations on stitchery and other crafts while Doreen McManus suggested we look into St. Lawrence College's crafts program whereby people interested in attending special demonstrations could do so at any time without being officially registered as students. All members were in favour of more contact with the community and a closer look at a new orientation for Rideau Crafts. All in all, the meeting was a very productive one and we are looking forward to starting the field work next September.
