Mrs. Clifford Raison was in charge of the opening worship, also with the theme "Lest we forget". The leader said, in part, once each year on Nov. 11th, we pause for two minutes in remembrance of those of two world wars who did not come home. A few veterans still make the pilgrimage to Vimy Ridge each year. We at home pay honour and tribute. For all of us it is a time for remembrance and deep reflection. The Bible reading by Mrs. Glenn Chant was chosen from Psalm 89. The thought provoking Meditation closed with the poem "Let us have Peace", and the hymn "O God our help in ages past".

Mrs. Glenn Chant reported that the proceeds from the Harvest Supper were most gratifying. She also reported for the Stewardship secretary Mrs. H. McElroy. Stewardship is our response to responsibility. This is a special year for the Japanese people in South East Alberta. The pictures helped capture some of the flavour of pioneer days in Canada's settlement and pointed out the part which the church and religion played in the lives of early settlers.

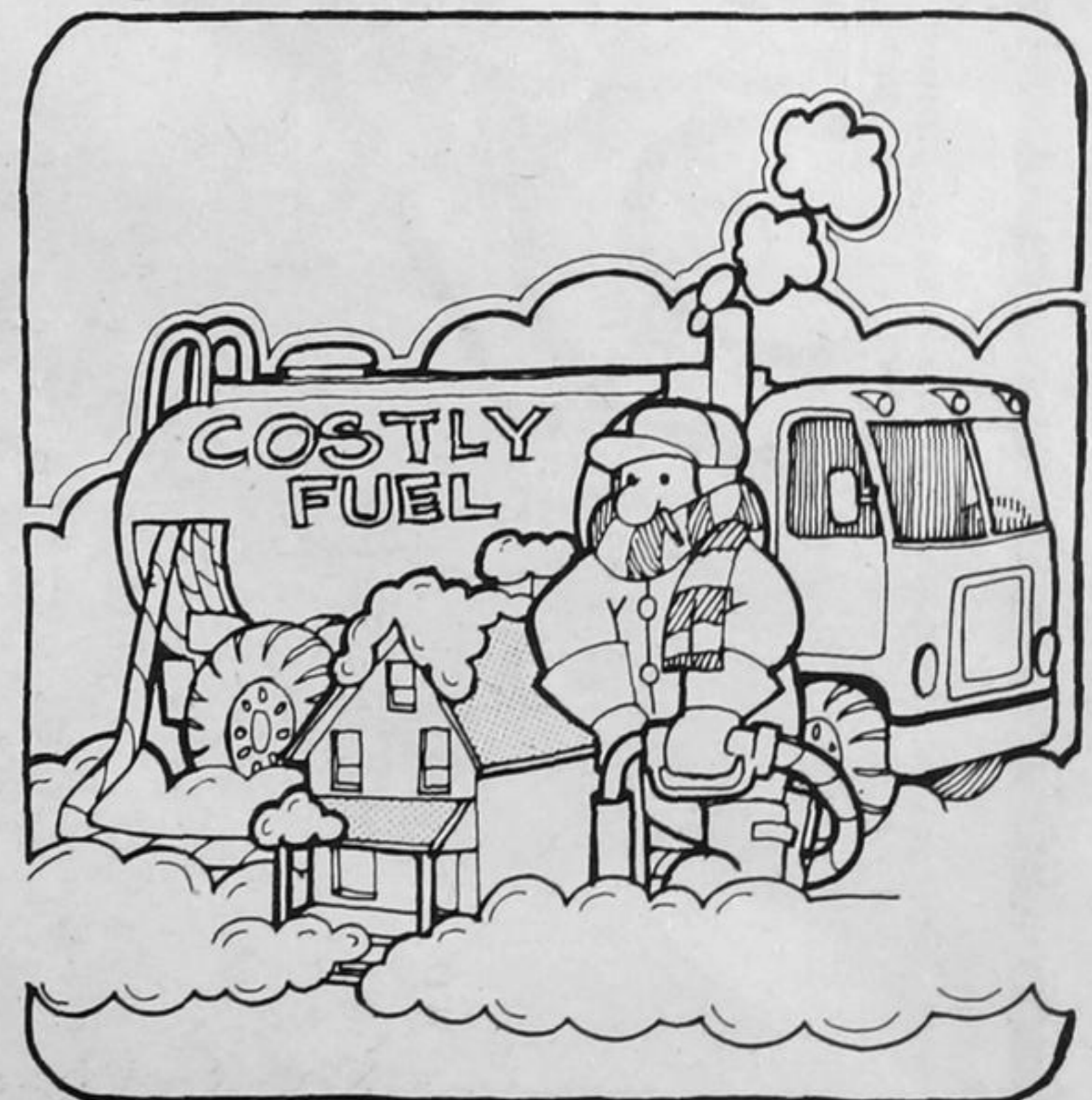
