The work includes typewriting the material, checking it, mimeographing it, collating and delivering it. By being both secretary one time and Office Manager the next time, the student is able to experience and appreciate the role of the employee and the supervisor.

During the months of September and October 115 orders were processed by the students. Some orders were relatively small, while others involved the typing and duplicating of thousands of sheets of paper.

Students who are in charge of the Practice Office are on their own. They learn to co-operate and get along with visitors and associates. This situation enables them to meet and solve problems and to assist others in doing so.


Judy Timpany and Marcia Nightingale were inducted into the chapter by acting president Judy Pattinson.
