COUNCIL BRIEFS FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF THE REAR OF LEEDS AND LANSDOWNE

AUGUST 15, 1977 - OCTOBER 17, 1977.

Mrs. Lorraine Trick was appointed to THE RIDEAU LAKES UNION LIBRARY BOARD to replace resigned member Harry LaPierre, for the duration of his term.

The Clerk-Treasurer was authorized to apply to Ministry of Housing for a Community Study Grant to cover costs of printing and mailing with respect to By-Law No. 7-1977 regulating the erection of buildings within the Township.

Council authorized payment by Vouchers up to the sum of \$25.00 for each child from this Municipality who is attending school and who is registered in organized Minor Hockey or Figure Skating in Gananoque or Athens.

Council authorized payment of one-fifth of the 1977 Municipal taxes for St. Lawrence Medical Centre.

The Clerk was authorized to petition the Ministry of Transportation and Communications for interim payment of subsidy for roads.

A By-law to provide for the erection of a stop sign at the intersection of Brier Hill Road and the road between Townships, Lot 19, Concession 11, Leeds, in accordance with Section 89 of The Highway Traffic Act received its three readings, was signed by the Reeve, numbered 17-1977 and entered into the By-law Book.

Council endorsed the recommendation of The Seeleys Bay Volunteer Fire Department with respect to installation of smoke detectors, that all new buildings in the Township have smoke detectors installed.

Council authorized the purchase of a John Deere crawler, front-end loader, backhoe and tri-axle trailer from Clifford Restruck for \$6,000.00.

A grant in the amount of \$50.00 to the Lyndhurst Santa Claus Parade was authorized.

Invitation tenders were called for 500 cu yds of screened sand, stacked at Township Garage. Tenders to close at noon on November 1, 1977.

Due to the hunting season, the next regular meeting of Council will be held on Tuesday, November 1, 1977 in the Council Chambers at 8:00 P.M.

The congregations of Olivet, Seeleys Bay and Lyndhurst United Churches will meet in Lyndhurst United Church for their Annual Laymen's Sunday Service on Sun. October 30, 10:00 a.m. (standard time).

There will be special music by the men's choir. Guest speaker - Mr. Roland Glendinning of Brockville.

Lunch is free and supplied by the Anglican & United Church Ladies. The Senior Citizens are providing cookies for the children.

During the afternoon session, it is hoped that together we can develop practical proposals for meeting the needs and challenges of our community.
