AMBULANCE SERVICE "SAVED" \*\*\*\*\*\* \*\*\*\*\*

BY SIX WOMEN

SEELEY'S BAY - WOMEN POWER HAS HELPED SOLVE AN ACUTE VOLUNTEER "MANPOWER" SHORTAGE AT THE EMERGENCY AMBULANCE SERVICE HERE.

SIX OF EIGHTEEN RECRUITS

ARE FEMALE VOLUNTEERS WHO

HAVE BEEN ENLISTED FOLLOWING
WIDESPREAD CONCERNS ABOUT THE
SERVICE.

THE VOLUNTEERS HAVE GIVEN A MUCH NEEDED BOOST. MANY OF THE WOMEN ARE AT HOME AND CAN BE ON CALL DURING THE DAY, WHILE MANY OF THE MEN ARE WORKING OUT OF TOWN. THE NEW FORCE IS IN ITS FIRST MONTH OF OPERATION, AND THINGS ARE GOING SMOOTHLY.

THE NUMBER OF VOLUNTEERS
HAD DECLINES IN RECENT YEARS.
SOME PEOPLE HAD MOVED AWAY,
OTHERS WERE GETTING OLD AND
WERE TIRED OF BEING ON CALL.
MANY VOLUNTEERS HAD JOBS OUT
OF TOWN AND HAD TO ARRANGE
FOR SOMEONE ELSE TO COVER
THEM WHILE THEY WERE AT WORK.
WHEN THE NUMBER OF VOLUNTEERS
DWINDLED TO EIGHT, THE SITUATION BECAME ACUTE. IT BECAME IMPOSSIBLE TO SCHEDULE
SHIFTS OF TWO PEOPLE EACH.

EVERYONE IN THE COMMUNITY
SEEMED TO AGREE THAT THE
AMBULANCE SERVICE WAS DESPERATELY NEEDED, ACCORDING TO
DR. S. WEBB, ITS DIRECTOR.
THEY RECEIVED ABOUT 230 CALLS
PER YEAR AND ARE THE ONLY
SERVICE ON HIGHWAY 15 BETWEEN
SMITHS FALLS AND KINGSTON, IN
AN AREA WHERE THERE ARE NUMEROUS AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENTS.



LARRY GIBSON, PROPRIETOR
OF THE CARVETH NURSING HOME,
EXPLAINED THAT LETTERS WERE
SENT TO APPROXIMATELY 40 LOCAL
RESIDENTS IN AN ATTEMPT TO
STIMULATE THOSE CONCERNED TO
ACT. AN EFFORT WAS MADE TO
RECRUITE WOMEN WHO HAD NOT
PREVIOUSLY PARTICIPATED IN THE
AMBULANCE SERVICE.

WHEN A GROUP OF INTERESTED PEOPLE WAS COLLECTED. DR. WEBB REQUESTED THAT THE ST. JOHN AMBULANCE SERVICE GIVE THEM A COURSE. TED SLOAMER, FROM KINGSTON'S HOTEL DIEU GAVE THE COURSE FOR SIX MORNINGS. DR. WEBB, WHO HAD PREVIOUSLY CONDUCTED THESE COURSES, WAS THE EXAMINER.

NO DEMAND WAS MADE OF THOSE TAKING THE COURSE 18 HAVE NOW BECOME VOLUNTEERS.
