CARVETH RETURNS!

Carveth Lodge

CARVETH NURSING HOME LIMITED, the family owned and operated nursing home and retirement lodge in Gananoque, Ontario has decided to re-open their facility in Seeley's Bay. After over a year of their absence from Seeley's Bay, the Village will once again have a Senior Citizen Home.

On November 11th, 1978, Carveth Nursing Home closed it's doors in Seeley's Bay and moved to a new modern health care facility, in Gananoque. Since that time, the building on l'ain Street has remained empty. However, the owners of Carveth, the Gibson Family, now have disclosed their intention of opening the Seeley's Bay Home as a Retirement Home for Senior Citizens. Their experience and reputation of caring for the Seniors of Leeds County over the past 15 years will now be available in Seeley's Ray.

CARVETH LODGE SEELEY'S BAY, as the home will be called, will accommodate a maximum of thirty (30) residents. It is the belief of the Gibsons that a small home offers the resident much more comfort and atmosphere than a large institution. Most of the accommodation will be available in private rooms. Semi-Private accommodation will also be available, permitting married couples to remain together.

The Lodge will be staffed twenty-four hours a day by experienced staff previously trained by Carveth in their Nursing Home. In actual fact, the staff used to be employed in Carveth when it was operating in Seeley's Bay. The residents will be given all their meals cooked in a home-like fashion using the Cana'a Food Guidelines.

For those of you who have been inside the Seeley's Bay facility will quickly agree that indeed the new Lodge will offer the Seniors of Leeds County a true home away from home.

The daily rates to be charged at the Lodge will be significantly below any other retirement home in Leeds. Private Rooms will cost only \$18.00 a day, while Semi-Private will cost only \$16.00 per day. When one considers the cost of maintaining and heating today ones own home, let alone feeding oneself three meals a day, the rates are extremely reasonable and affordable.

The Gibson Family have advised that applications may now be submitted by Senior Citizens seeking accommodation in Carveth Seeley's Bay. Applications or further information may be obtained by writing Carveth Care Centre, 375 James Street, Gananoque, Ontario or by calling 382-4752.
