KIDS' STUFF

God's Eye

God's Eyes are made of brightly coloured yarn woven on two crossed sticks. To the Indians of Mexico and Bolivia they represent good luck, fortune, wealth and health.

To make a God's Eye you'll need:

- * 2 sticks of the same size.Use straight twigs, popsicle sticks, plastic stirrers or chopsticks.
- * scissors
- * yarn in two or three bright colours.

NOW:


Cross the sticks in the centre, and tie them tightly with the end of the first colour of yarn.

Begin by weaving the yarn over one arm and under, around and over the next one. Continue around the sticks in this fashion, moving out from the centre.

Be sure to push the yarn in to the centre, keeping it snug.

Change colours by tying a new piece of yarn to the end of the first. Hide knots by tucking them under.

To finish off, tie the end of the yarn around and under one arm of the cross.
