

A loan cupboard is available for such equipment as hospital beds, commodes, wheel chairs and walkers for use in the home.

Because of their colour the tombac 5¢ coins were not very popular with storekeepers, many of whom put the coins to one side to keep them from circulating. This would account for the relative ease with which one can get these coins in really nice condition today.

Currently price range for worn to uncirculated coins are:

1942 Tombac Beaver..50¢ - \$4. 1943 Tombac V.....30¢ - \$4. 1944 Steel V.....20¢ - \$3. 1945 Steel V.....20¢ - \$3.

After the war the mint withdrew the tombac coins from circulation and over 60% of them have been melted down. In 1946 the mint resumed using nickel for these coins and reverted to the pre-war Beaver reverse but still retained the twelve sides.

ANSWER:

As of March 1, 1980 car insurance is compulsory in Ontario. As a result the Unsatisfied Judgement Fund, for all practical purposes, has been discontinued. However, it is still possible to be involved in an accident with an uninsured car e.g. a stolen vehicle or a vehicle on which the insurance is lapsed. In such a case your own insurance will now automatically come into play by a new extension under which any injuries or damages to your vehicle are paid up to \$100,000.
