South Crosby seeks senior citizen housing

With the approval of the Ministry of Housing and Central Mortgage & Housing Corp. (CMHC), Elgin may see the erection of an apartment building on the old continuation school site this spring.

The site is being sold to Youngtown Industries Ltd., headed by Eldon Coon of Delta. They plan to erect a two-storey building. Eight ground floor units are to be available for senior citizens, with rent geared to income. The ground floor will also include a common room for use of residents. Ten units on the top floor will be let to the public.

The Ministry of Housing is hedging on whether the population density of South Crosby warrants a senior citizen housing project. In a Ministry survey, some residents did express interest in seeing such apartments available. The proportion of residents over 65 is higher than average in North Leeds.

Youngtown Industries hopes to get approval in time to build in the spring. Anyone interested in these apartments is asked to call the township office at 359-5830.
