#### NORTH CROSBY RECEIVES GRANTS

Dr. Mendel McEwen, Chairman of the North Crosby Recreation Committee has announced that a total of \$16,000 has been made available to the Township from Wintario and Community Centre Grants. This will make it possible to go ahead with plans for the new park and recreation centre just south of the Perth Rd., about 1.5 miles west of the Village of Westport.

Future plans for the park include a combined township office and recreation hall, tennis courts and picnic facilities. As soon as levelling can be carried out on the property, a new ball diamond will be laid out.

The Committee has already raised \$1,000 toward the centre. Future fund raising projects include: a ski-a-thon, a skate-a-thon, and a fly-a-thon by the local model airplane club. A bottle drive is also being considered.


