

Seelev's Bay Public Library recently received a gift of 1,200 from the family of Ervin and Sarah Alexander.
This donation has been used to purchase books and the "Alexander Collection" is now in place in Seeley's Bay Library. A cross section of books were requested by the donors and you will find child-hood favourites, adult fiction, biographies and special interest books such as gardening, cooking, Canadian History etc.

The Alexanders were residents of Leeds and Lansdowne for many years and Mrs Alexander lived in the village of Seeley's Bay with her sister Mrs. Liza Gilmore for a number of years before her lemise.
