- Men's Low Net - June and Stan Webb Trophy - Mike Hamilton 69

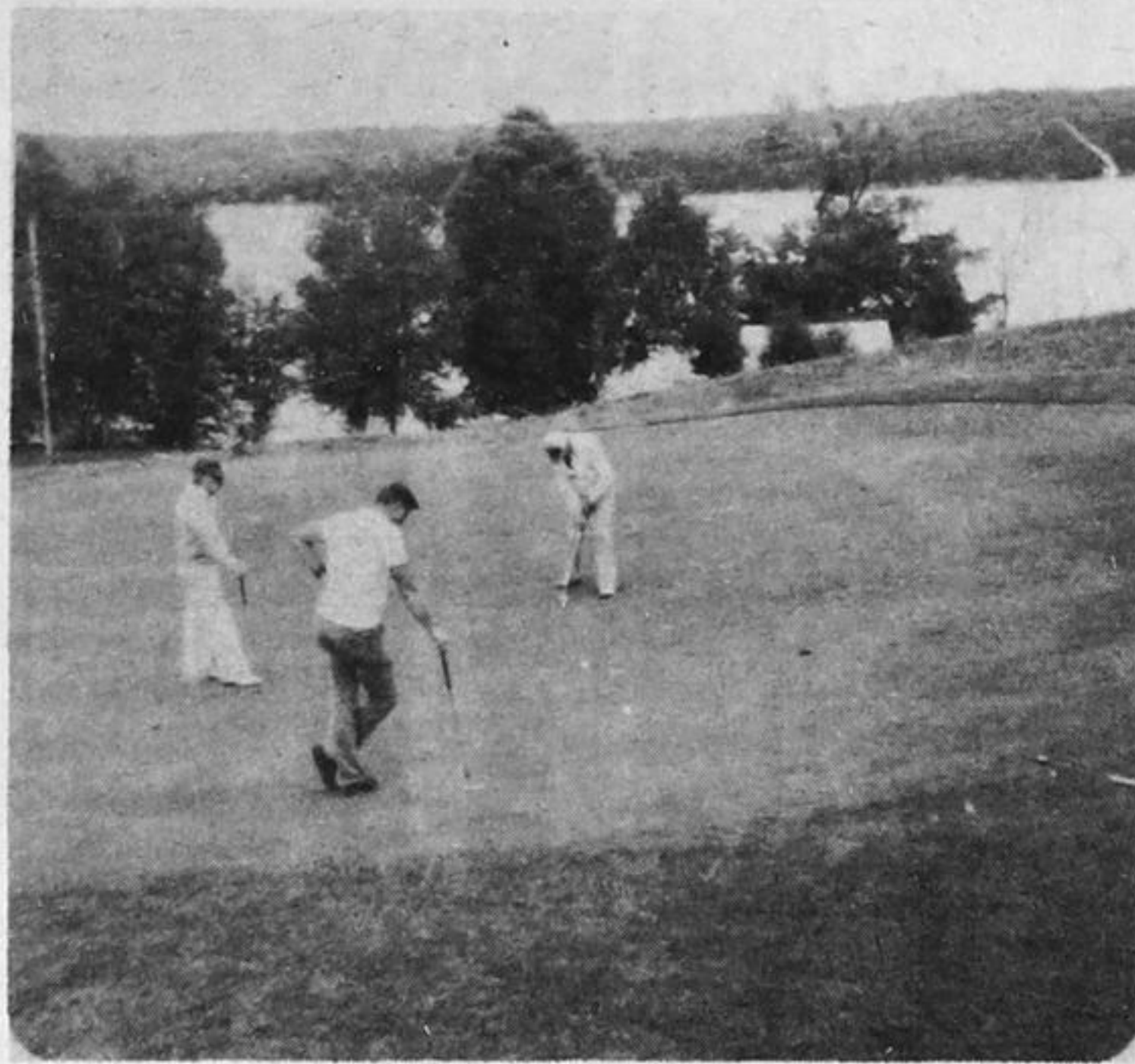
All winners received a small trophy to keep as well.

New minister appointed

THE REV. R.A. QUAMMIE
AT

SEELEY'S BAY UNITED CHURCH

The Induction Service for the Rev. R. A. Quammie was held at the Seeley's Bay United Church, Wednesday, Sept. 12th, 1979.

The service began at 8:00 p.m. and was conducted by the Rev. J. Harry Seeley, of the Elgin Pastoral Charge, and the Sermon was preached by the Rev. Edward Sam, of the Bath Pastoral Charge. The act of Induction was performed by the Rev. Murray McGlasham of Lyn, and Chairman of the Kingston Presbytery. There were present not only many members of the congregations of the Seeley's Bay Charge, but many representatives of Kingston Presbytery and other friends and well-wishers. There was a fine social evening in the Church CE Room following the service.

Rev. Quammie was born and educated in Dominica in the British Caribbean. On graduation from secondary school he taught for six and a half years before candidating for the Methodist Ministry in 1958. He attended the Union Theological Seminary in Kingston, Jamaica, W.I. from 1958-1962 graduating with the UTS Diploma and gaining First Prize in Philosophy, Church History, Theology, Practical Theology and Biblical Studies.

He was assigned to Haiti soon after that, and ministered there for seven years, returning to Jamaica in December 1969. After working in Pastorates in Jamaica for six and a half years, Mr. Quammie was transferred to, and admitted by the United Church of Canada in March 1975. His first pastorate in Canada was his recent Charge of Florence-Rutherford-Dawn Valley in Kent Presbytery of the London Conference.

Rev. Quammie also holds the Diploma in Theology and the Bachelor of Divinity (Hons) of the University of London, and the Master of Arts degree in Religious Studies of the University of Windsor, Ontario.

At the B.D. Hons level he majored in Biblical Studies including Hebrew and Hellenistic Greek and just prior to coming to Seeley's Bay he was a Sessional Lecturer in Old Testament at the University of Windsor.

His wife, Arsinoe Quammie, though now a British subject, was born and educated in Haiti, West Indies, and is a bi-lingual secretary by training. She has recently obtained the Ontario Certificate in Management Development. The Quammies are both bi-lingual (French-English) and have three children: Elizabeth (10½ yrs), Andrelle (9 yrs) and Gerry (4 yrs).

They are all happy to be in Seeley's Bay and to be part of the on-going ministry of the Charge and of Kingston Presbytery.

ARSENIC & OLD LACE

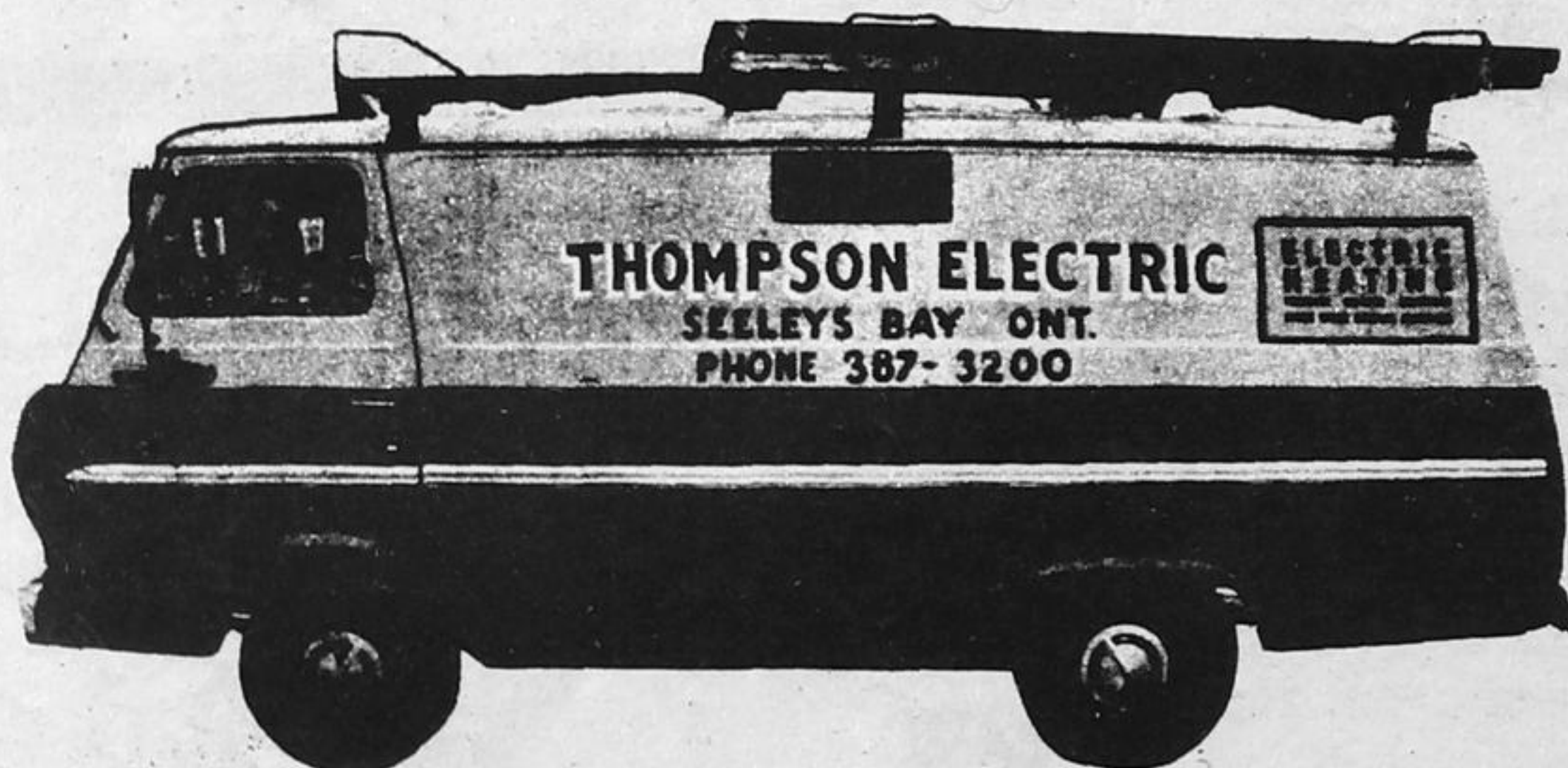
