The Public Health Nurses in the Gananoque branch of the Leeds, Grenville & Lanark Health Unit will be conducting a series of seven (7) prenatal classes for expectant parents beginning February 6, 1980.

The classes are held at the Health Unit at 99 King Street east in Gananoque from 7 - 9 p.m. on Wednesday evenings.

By discussion, films, body building exercises, breathing and relaxation techniques, the expectant mother learns how to have a more comfortable pregnancy. Physical and emotional aspects of this new experience are explored.

The stages of labour and the mechanics of delivery are explained in detail. expectant father learns how to coach his wife through labour and delivery, if he chooses to do so. Therefore it is important that the father attend as many classes as possible.

Infant feeding and care are covered too. The hospital is visited before the expected date of delivery to familiarize the couple with the admission procedure, visiting privileges, the lay-out of the nursery, labour and delivery rooms.
