

A BIG THEE FOR THE CENTES. NIAL .- A section of one of the big trees of California is on its way to Philadelphia for exhibition at the Centennial It passed through Omahn on the eighth inst., and the Bee of that place thus describes it : "The tree from which this section was cut grew in the Kaweah and King's River Grove, near, the line of Frenso and Talare counties, California, on the west slope of the Sierra Nevadas, at an elevation of 6,500 feet above the level of the sea, forty five roiles from Visalia. the nearest railroad station.
