

on his own account to the head market. We have thus shown that the farmer cannot get his grain for the exporter or foreign consumer without employing middlemen of some kind and that it is likely to be most profitable for him to sell to the regular dealer at home.

There is, however, another important point for the farmer to consider. If the entire farming community of the country purchased directly from the importer and manufacturer, and sold to the exporter, the local dealers and the local trade centres would be wiped out of existence.
