The Wender of the Brain. One of the most inconceivable things in the nature of the brain is. that the organ of sensation should in itself be insensible. It is only by communication with the brain that any kind of sensation is produced yet the organ itself is insensible. But there is a circumstance more wonderful still. The brain itself
