. From the Western Gazette. Late on Thursday night, Nov. 16th, a dreadful murder was committed near Sutton Bingham, by a band of notorious poachers. It appears that about midnight three men named Hutchings-two of whom had only recently been liberated from prison-and another noted character, were seen in a lane at Netherton, with a horse and cart. Constables Cox and Stacey who had seen the men carlier in the evening, and suspected that they had been poaching, spoke to them. The party were evidently prepared for all emergencies, for immediately one of them took a life-preserver or some other deadly Debts Collected on Commission. weapon from the cart, and with one blow felled Cox to the ground. Death must have been instantaneous. They then beat him about the head in a frightful manner. Stacey defended himself with his staff, bu he was overpowered, and was felled to the ground. He had a horse saddled and rode into Yeovil and informed Sergeant Holwel! of the murder. 
