Committed to Jail. Young Green, who is said to be one of the boys from the Orphan Home in Galt, has been in the employ of Mr. Story for the past few months. The charge having been proven, he was committed to Milton jail to stand his trial for the serious offence.

Fatal Accident. Mr. Wm. Lundy, of this village, met with a very severe accident, on Tuesday, while attending a threshing machine at the farm of Mr. Kinnard, by which he has lost the greater part of his right hand. He had been greasing the machine when his hand was caught between two cog wheels of the gearing, and lacerated in a fearful manner. He was immediately brought home, and attended to by Dr. McFarvin and Dr. Lowry. The fragments of the bone were also summoned by telegraph, and on his arrival, Mr. Lundy was put under the influence of chloroform, when it was found on careful examination that only the thumb and a part of the little finger could be saved. His sufferings were now in a fair way for being.

The Guelph Abduction Case. The preliminary trial of F. Sturdy, for the forcible abduction of Miss Carr, was held at the Guelph Police Court, on Monday, Tuesday, and further examination postponed until this afternoon. So far as given, the testimony against Sturdy is even worse than was reported last week, and shows it to be one of the most heinous cases of abduction ever perpetrated in a civilized community in Canada. Of course we have only yet heard one side of the story, and it is but fair that judgment be withheld until the whole facts have been revealed. The affair has created an intense sensation in and around Guelph, all the parties concerned being so well known and previously held in high esteem.

Beardmore's Tannery at Bracebridge. The Bracebridge Gazette of the 27th ult., gives an interesting account of the new tannery premises being erected at that place, by Messrs. Beardmore & Son, proprietors of the Acton tannery. The editor of the Gazette mentions having interviewed our friends Mr. Richard Hamilton, the contractor, and Mr. Z. A. Hall, the manager of the works, by whom he was courteously received and from whom he obtained information concerning the capacity of the building and the process of manufacturing leather. From the published report we glean the following items, which may be of interest to many of our local readers:

Each yard, 65x112ft., one story; leach house and bark shed, 84x34ft., with lean-to, 31ft.; dry house, 61x37ft., five stories; wood pits, stone building, 45x35ft., one story; boiler house, 35x15ft., brick; engine house, 14x35ft., brick; in the centre of the engine house there will be a brick chimney, 30ft. high, with a stone foundation, 14x14ft., 6ft. deep, the chimney being hollow at the bottom, and consisting of inner and outer walls of brick work, but finally carried in the solid, as the wallapers on the outside. There will be eight boilers, 18x16ft., in the leach house. On the top of them will stand four tubs, 14ft. in diameter, and ten feet high. From the engine house to the yard a shaft will cross about 94ft. long, to work the hide mills and water pumps. There will be four water wheels, one building to the dry house and store shed, and from the store shed to the wharf. A wire rope to turn the shaft, in the dry house and engine house, will run from the engine house to the dry house, thus the loads of hides will be conveyed to the different stories of the dry house, each floor of which is traversed lengthwise by a tramway, working in the centre of a hall on either side of which are five rooms, each containing 100 sides of leather; the dry house could thus contain 5,000 hides, though in practice this number will not be reached, because some of the lower stories are occupied by a category of steam pipes.

About 150 cords of tan bark have been delivered on the piling grounds at opposite side of the river.

Twelve carpenters, 4 masons, and an average of 10 laborers are employed on the works, and the whole concern is estimated to make so big a hole in \$20,000, that the residue will be considerable.

The Beardmore tannery will probably be the largest tannery in Ontario, and certainly the model tannery in the Dominion.

FIRE AT KILBRIDE.—Last week the Kilbride Woolen Mills with all their contents, were destroyed by fire, cause supposed to be a spark from the smoke stack. There was about \$4,000 worth of stock in the building, besides the machinery. The loss will be considerable, but have not ascertained the amount. Insurance only \$1,000.

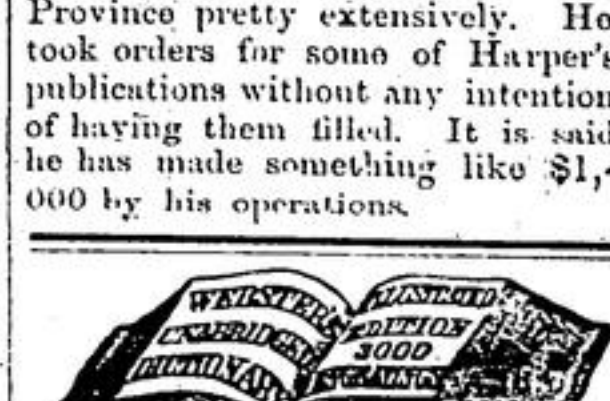

INSOLVENCY.—Some time ago, James Cavanagh, boot and shoe dealer at Rockwood, sold out his business to one Moore. Being somewhat involved, and desiring to meet his liabilities, his estate was put into insolvency, by Mullarky & Co., of Montreal, they being the heaviest creditors. A short time previous to the insolvency proceedings, it appears Moore had shipped large quantities of his goods to Belleville, and soon left himself. A concurrent writ of attachment was issued, and possession of the goods shipped was taken by the official assignee at that place. The estate is not likely to realize much for the creditors.

GRAND ENCAMPMENT.—The annual report of M. D. Davidson, Grand Scribe and Treasurer, presented at the Provincial Grand Encampment of Odd Fellows at Belleville, shows the total revenue was \$654.25, an increase of \$10,380 over that of last year. 225 members have been initiated, 36 admitted by card, 2 rejected, 5 reinstated, 59 suspended, 1 expelled and 23 died. The dues amounted to \$2005, an increase of \$80 over last year. The Encampment is reported clear of debt, and with assets amounting to \$102,567.

THE GAME LAW.—It is said by several keen sportsmen who take an active interest in seeing that the provisions of the Game Laws are vigorously carried out, that some amendment should be made to the Act to prohibit woodcocks being shot on the 1st of July. A woodcock's nest, with newly hatched chicks, may be found even as late as the end of July. The first of September would be a proper date to commence woodcock shooting.
